



CONFLICT MINERALS POLICY

NVIDIA implements sourcing and chain of custody due diligence practices designed to reasonably assure that minerals from the Democratic Republic of Congo and adjoining countries (DRC), including gold, tantalum, tungsten and tin (3TG), used in our products do not directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in the DRC. Our due diligence measures will be made available to our customers upon request.

We support, contribute to and rely on industry-wide efforts to validate that the minerals used in our products are not contributing to conflict and come from socially responsible sources. As a member of the Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition (EICC), we have adopted the EICC Code of Conduct, are a member of the Conflict-Free Sourcing Initiative (CFSI) and participate in work groups of the EICC-Global e-Sustainability Initiative and the CFSI. Further, our due diligence program will conform in all material respects with the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas.

Our goal is to use only "DRC conflict-free" 3TG in our products. In furtherance of this objective, we expect our suppliers to acquire materials from conflict-free sources within the DRC and to provide their supply chain conflict minerals information to us using the CFSI conflict minerals reporting template. NVIDIA will assess, and may withhold, future business with suppliers who do not comply with this policy.
