Public Policy and U.S. Federal Lobbying Compliance

NVIDIA engages in the public policy process to advance the long-term interests of the company and its shareholders.

NVIDIA's U.S. Federal lobbying activities are disclosed quarterly and publicly reported on the websites of the <u>U.S. Senate</u> and <u>U.S. House of Representatives</u>.

The following acts and activities require prior approval from NVIDIA Government Relations and Legal, including NVIDIA's Vice President of External Affairs and General Counsel:

- > Using NVIDIA funds for a political party, candidate, committee or organization.
- > Providing testimony or written comment on NVIDIA's behalf to a governmental body, agency, or official.
- > Lobbying any government on policy issues.
- > Committing NVIDIA to join a trade association or other similar organization.

Trade and Industry Associations

NVIDIA is a member of trade and industry associations worldwide. NVIDIA's participation in trade associations, including membership on a trade association board, does not indicate NVIDIA agrees with the trade association's position on any issue. In 2025, NVIDIA belonged to trade associations in the U.S., including:

- > Semiconductor Industry Association (SIA)
- > Information Technology Innovation Council (ITI)
- > TechNet
- > National Governors Association (NGA)

Political Activity

Although NVIDIA is not a political organization, NVIDIA may provide contributions or provide other support to political organizations, campaigns, candidates, or causes that NVIDIA's management concludes are in the company's best interests and aligned with the company's priorities and objectives, subject to the amount limitations and source prohibitions of applicable law. NVIDIA will publish a semiannual report on any such contributions.

Political contributions made by NVIDIA employees in their individual capacity are not subject to this policy.
